What's going on in WSI!

➤ WSI Segments Official ISO 9001:2015 Audit

WSI anticipates to be officially audited by QS in about a month regarding the performance of WSI segments and compliancy to ISO standards. S&M team has been directly working with segment managers to ensure that the main clauses of standard are being considered within each segment. High-risk issues, that could potentially lead to a major non-conformity, such as equipment's calibration license updates, risk management, training etc., have been tackled in preparation for the upcoming stage-2 audit. Furthermore, 2022 Technical Training Plan, is being developed as it's been identified as a non-conformity during stage-1 audit. In addition, non-conformities regarding HSE and Procurement departments, that had been identified during stage-1 audit, have been mitigated. Non-conformities include Supplier Evaluation, Outsource, Training, Lessons Learned and Knowledge Management, Inspection/Drill Planning and Execution, and Annual Employee Medical Checkup processes.



WSI is prepared and confident to successfully pass the official QS audit to obtain ISO 9001:2015 certification. As reflected in the previous version of Newsletter, PIA is few steps away to obtain "Contractor Safety" certification. PIA is currently providing additional documentation and information to fulfill the remaining requirements requested by the government. It is noteworthy that "Contractor Safety" certification is a mandatory requirement to participate in tenders, and it directly contributes to PIA revenue gain and reputation, therefore it is one of the highest PIA business priorities.

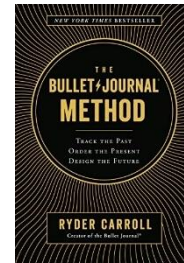

➤ Drive safe in this winter

Driving in winter weather - snow, ice, wet and cold creates a great challenge for vehicles and drivers. Keeping your vehicle in good technical repair reduces your overall chances for any mishap or disaster while driving - particularly in winter weather.



➤ Prepare your car for winter conditions:

To prepare your vehicle for winter driving give it a complete checkup. Look for the following:

• Electrical system

Battery - recharge or replace if the battery is weak. Ignition - check for damaged ignition wires and cracks in the distributor cap. Lights-check all lights (headlights, side lights, emergency flashers, directional lights, taillights, brake lights and parking lights) for proper functioning.

• Brakes

Check brakes and adjust to ensure equal braking.

• Tires

The traction between tires and roadway determines how well a vehicle rides, turns and stops, and is crucial for safe driving in winter.

Use four snow tires that are of the same type, size, speed rating, and load index for better handling, control and stability.

Use chains or studded tires on all four wheels when you expect severe snow and icy roads. Check with your local Department or Ministry of Transportation office to see if the use of tire chains or studded tires is legal in the region through which you are planning to drive.

Check tire pressure and if necessary restore it to levels recommended by the vehicle manufacturer.

Check the wear of the tires.

Check tire balance and correct if necessary.

Check wheel alignment and correct if necessary.

• Exhaust system

Check the exhaust system for leaks.

Keep the window in your vehicle slightly open when you're stuck in snow, and run the engine and heater to keep warm.

Keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow.

• Heating/Cooling system

Check the radiator and hoses for leaks.

Ensure that your vehicle always has a sufficient amount of antifreeze rated for the coldest weather.

Check the defrosters (front and back) to make sure they are working efficiently

• Windshield wipers

Ensure that windshield wipers function efficiently. Replace them if they are old or worn. Fill the washer container with an antifreeze fluid and top it up frequently.

• Fuel

Fill up the fuel tank before you leave on your trip.

Do not let the fuel level get too low!

• Prepare yourself for winter driving

Plan your driving in advance.

Avoid driving when fatigued.

Contact your provincial "Road Reports"

Where ever possible, postpone the trip when the weather is bad.

Check weather conditions for your travel route (and time) before you begin driving.

Plan your arrival time at a destination.

Inform someone of your route and planned arrival time.

Choose warm and comfortable clothing.

Warm up your vehicle BEFORE driving off. NEVER warm up your vehicle in a closed garage.

Remove snow and ice from your vehicle.

Bring a cell phone if you have one but do not leave it in the car as the battery will freeze.
